# CTDA FOCUS ON BUSINESS

#### O'Hara's, 24 Fraser Street, Clunes

This is the first article in a series on local businesses. We'll be making our way down Fraser Street and around the corner onto Service Street in the coming months, providing you with insights on the businesses in town.

O'Hara's sells a wide range of baked goods in store and offers catering services and special-occasion cakes to order.

Still fondly known as "the bakery" O'Hara's has seen a few changes over the years, but one thing has remained the same for over a decade: business owners, Matt and Wendy O'Kelly, who came to Clunes 16 years ago. Both Wendy and Matt have a strong background in food retail, Matt as a manager and Wendy as an assistant manager for Safeway. Their experience is evident in the success of the business, which employs two part-time and four casual staff.

Wendy and Matt bought the bakery four years after moving to Clunes because Matt wanted a change with work. They had been thinking about buying a takeaway café business for some time, and had been looking all over without success when, by chance, they saw an ad for the Clunes Bakery. Self-taught as a baker and pastry cook – her father worked in the first hot bread kitchen in Victoria at Ashwood – Wendy has worked in bakeries all her life and has always wanted to run a pie shop. Her love of pies comes through in the quality and variety on offer. As most Clunes residents

know, the bread making side of the business has since closed after trying, unsuccessfully, for a year to find a baker, they made the decision to focus on their other fare. The café tables were removed during the pandemic and the business is now what they had envisioned: a takeaway food shop-cum-patisserie offering hot and cold baked goods, pies, pasties, sausage rolls, and a huge ranges of pastries, muffins, slices, and other delectables.

With everything made in store, and only quality ingredients like butter (rather than substitutes) used, O'Hara's offers locals and visitors a huge range of delicious buttery baked goods, pies, and seasonal fare. So, whether it's lunch on the fly, a delicious meal to heat up at home, a party to cater, or a cake to celebrate a birthday or other special event, O'Hara's is a great place to get good quality, locally-made food.

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## **VALUE OF NEIGHBOURHOOD HOUSES**

Building community is a long game. It's a complicated blend of environment, assets, socio-economic factors, and humanity that works together in a way that is inherently tricky and nuanced. It's hard to have an impact unless you are a part of it because among all these variables, it's the shared values, connections and experiences that ultimately knit a community together. This combines to give purpose, create belonging and ultimately support resilience, but if you are going to be a part of something bigger, it's important to know what part you bring to the table.

Like lots of incorporated associations, Clunes
Neighbourhood House has just held our Annual General
Meeting. The process of reporting to our membership makes
us reflective. For many years we've made a point of pausing
to think about why we do what we do, the future we seek,
the values that drive us and the results we intend to achieve.
Our vision of 'a community actively caring for all people
and place' has given us a strong sense of purpose. People's
roles at Neighbourhood House (volunteer and paid) have
meaning in the bigger picture of the community (via the
groups we support/ally with) and we work to understand
how our work connects to others and adds value to the
whole.

Sometimes this all sounds a little grandiose or theoretical. But keeping our purpose in mind helps us maintain a line of sight during rough times, building a sense of connectedness over time that we believe can make the most of what we've all got together. In fact, we believe it can help you pack a punch that wouldn't be possible alone.


You don't often get to measure the impact you are having but, every year, Victorian Neighbourhood Houses are assessed by a Deloitte Access Economics monetary value of Neighbourhood Houses study. The results coincided with our reporting period and, this year, they really demonstrated what is possible when you play a long game and come together as a community.

Volunteers contributed \$408,589 worth of value to our community life

\$224,961 worth of emergency relief was provided directly or through partnerships

Annually, Clunes Neighbourhood House receives recurrent funding from the Victorian State Government of \$85,000 to open its door for 30 hours a week. We raise additional funds through our social enterprise BOOM Clunes and secure grants for projects. In 2022, for every \$1 that Clunes Neighbourhood House was funded we generated \$8.78. For every hour the Neighbourhood House, Men's Shed, Attitude and BOOM Clunes were in use, we (and you) provided \$373.18 worth of value.

## **CLUNES FIRE BRIGADE OUR PEOPLE**

As outlined in last month's article, the Clunes CFA Brigade is a totally voluntary organisation. Our membership sits at around 35-40 people and, among these approximately 15-20 make themselves available to attend call outs along with a core group of 10-12 regular firefighters.

To attend an incident, a firefighter must have completed a basic skills training module.

CFA provides and pays for a wide variety of further training to allow personnel to undertake a variety of tasks for the Brigade including appliance drivers, use of breathing apparatus, specialist training in structural fires (houses/buildings). Personal Protective Equipment is provided free to all firefighters with both wildfire (bush and grass fires) and structural fire outfits provided after training is completed. This kit includes boots, helmets, gloves, goggles etc. and a pair of very fetching braces to keep the "yellows" in place.

What our Brigade does not lack is experience. What we are needing is new members with whom we can share this experience. Many of us are getting a little "long in the tooth" and we need a new generation of firefighters.

Every two years members elect their officers and other position holders. On the operational side we have a Captain and 4 Lieutenants (one of these Lieutenants is usually a training position). All have extensive experience and most have significant additional training. Each officer has an allocated primary responsibility including vehicles/equipment, staff training

etc. The Brigade also has an elected Secretary/Treasurer to provide administrative

functions. These is also a designated liaison person with the Firefighters Association,

others with a focus on community education/promotion, and some who undertake fire

equipment maintenance (extinguishers etc.) in the community.

There are a wide range of tasks to involve new volunteers ( it isn't all about sitting in a truck racing around the district, although that is our core business). Training is provided in virtually every aspect of our operations.

Last but not least, I must say that morale and the sense of camaraderie in our small Brigade

is excellent. It is truly an inclusive environment. Come and join us, start by checking out



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
