

## **CLUNES FIRE BRIGADE**

### WHO WE ARE AND WHAT WE DO

As one of the Clunes and district's oldest volunteer organisations – now 159 years and counting – we felt it was time to tell the community we serve a little more about us. Longer-term residents may be well aware of who we are and what we do, but for many of our newer residents, especially those moving from 'the big smoke' we may seem to be a visible, but well kept secret. In coming months we hope to bring you regular articles and report on new developments, incidents etc.

Let's start with the basics: we are a combined rural and urban brigade. We have neighbouring brigades in Glendaruel, Mt. Cameron and Ullina which are all single truck rural brigades. Our neighbouring brigades include Talbot and Creswick. Our fire station is located at 19 Alliance St, next to the Lee Medlyn House of Bottles.

We are a completely volunteer brigade and have been since 1864. Our volunteer numbers fluctuate with significant variations with the availability of our members to 'turn out' ie. respond to an incident. As part of a CFA District we always have back-up options depending on the nature of the incident. We are activated via a pager system held by each active member in response to a 000 call. Our target is to be on the road within six minutes of the alarm. You might also hear the station's fire siren sound until we respond.

Our call out reasons vary considerably. Obviously fires are our 'core business', be they grass, bush or structural (houses, sheds etc.) or vehicles. CFA Victoria is tasked to respond to such fires on private property. We also attend motor vehicle accidents, often as the first responder, managing the scene until police, ambulance etc. arrive. Together with the SES and other emergency services we can also be called on for floods, rescues etc.

All our volunteers are trained, many of us in multiple roles (more on that next time) and we have a variety of equipment available (again, more later). We hope to provide you with further details of our local brigade and how we operate in future newsletters. As a departing 'plug' please give some thought to joining us as a volunteer. The trial collection of food organics and garden organics (FOGO) in Clunes has been extended while Council considers the plan for FOGO collection shirewide. The trial has been a great success thanks to the efforts of residents to appropriately separate waste streams. Please continue to separate your waste and reduce contamination. Crews were busy in Ullina reconstructing 1.6 kilometres of Ullina Kooroocheang Road between Daylesford Clunes Road and Kellys Lane in April. This \$700,000 project is funded by Council and the Federal Government through the Heavy Vehicle Safety and Productivity Program. Works include widening the road, drainage upgrades and the construction of two new bus stops addressing safety concerns raised by local residents and Public Transport Victoria. The final seal of the road will be carried out next year.
